Edgemont Incorporation Notice

Greenburgh is a strongly Democratic Town. The selected Democratic candidate without a primary opponent will most certainly be elected.

Our current State Assembly Representative, Mary-Jane Shimsky has no primary opponent and will be able to continue in office without explaining to her constituents why she did not take a strong position against Edgemont's incorporation efforts. The incorporation of Edgemont will result in higher taxes and reduced services for unincorporated Greenburgh residents.

Saving Greenburgh Coalition (SGC) will be gathering signatures to have Tom Abinanti, our previous State Representative on the ballot as a candidate. Working to have Abinanti on the ballot **is not an endorsement**, but rather provides opportunities for Mary-Jane Shimsky to explain why she did not work harder to protect Greenburgh against incorporation efforts and her strategy on this issue in the future. Similarly, it provides Tom Abinanti the opportunity to explain what he would have done if he was still our State Representative and what his plans are on this issue if elected.

The goal of SGC is to foster informative primary discussions (hopefully one in our Clubhouse) by the candidates. This effort should provide the public with valuable information needed to cast an informed vote in November.
